As a certified PA with a clinical background in academic hospital medicine, addiction medicine, and palliative care, Dr. Bottner is passionate about team-based healthcare models, quality improvement, and evidence-based operational improvements. Dr. Bottner most recently served at the Colorado Hospital Association (CHA) as vice president of clinical excellence. At CHA, he led the association's Center for Clinical Leadership and Excellence, focusing on improving care through legislative and regulatory advocacy, statewide quality improvement initiatives, thought leadership, workforce development, and educational programming.

Prior to CHA, Dr. Bottner was an Assistant Professor of Internal Medicine at Dell Medical School, where he directed the Buprenorphine Team, a federally funded program providing treatment to hospitalized patients with opioid use disorder. His prior entrepreneurial achievements include starting five companies between the ages of 14 and 24, earning recognition as a Bloomberg Business Week Top 25 U.S. Entrepreneurs Under 25.
